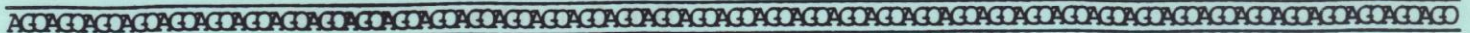

## THE DEAN'S DOLLOP

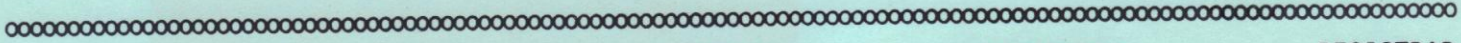
As most Chapter members know by now, the LDS Church has endorsed the AGO. One of the requirements for a stake to qualify to request a pipe organ is that at least three organists in the stake have an AGO Service Playing Certificate.

The Chapter has made a commitment to the organists of our area to run beginning training classes on a stake basis. The syllabus for that course is ready and details will be provided at the January Chapter meeting.

Our October meeting was devoted to a discussion of how Brigham Young University's Music Department can help in the training and preparation of organists through its certification program to take the AGO Service Playing Examination.

In addition, the Chapter will run Exam Prep classes as needed. The Chapter is committed to support the efforts of area organists to improve their service playing. Anyone attending the Provo Central Stake Christmas Choir Service has a vision of what a pipe organ and musical commitment can do for the spiritual growth of members.

We have been told that an ersatz organ is just as good, but it has yet to be demonstrated. My stake took a survey to determine how many people had been activated through the stake sports program over the last ten years. Results: "one-half person"! Good music hath greater power.

## RECIPE CORNER

### Russian Tea

Boil 5 minutes: 2 c. water  
2 c. sugar

Then add and bring to boil:

2 c. orange juice  
2 qt. water  
1 t. almond extract  
3/4 c. lemon juice  
2 t. vanilla

Serve hot or cold.

### Pumpkin Bread

Sift: 2 c. flour  
1 1/2 t. cinnamon  
1/2 t. ginger  
1/4 t. cloves  
2 t. soda  
1 t. salt

Beat 5 minutes:

4 eggs  
2 c. sugar  
1 c. oil

Add dry ingredients. Add 1 small can pumpkin (14 oz.). Mix well. Pour into well greased 12 x 17 sheet pan. Bake 350 degrees for 30-35 min. Cool and serve with whipped cream. Makes 24 2-inch servings.
