DUES AND MEMBERSHIP FORMS

It's dues time, again. Since the AGO fiscal year ends on June 30th, National Headquarters has asked that we pay our dues between July 1st through August 31st, so that they can prepare for 1996-97 year. Paying your dues promptly also helps our local chapter plan for our own upcoming activities.

You will gain the most benefit if you register as a regular, special, student, partner, or dual member. These membership categories entitle you to vote (locally and nationally), receive "The American Organist" magazine and chapter newsletter, be a chapter officer, sign up for AGO insurance, have an AGO credit card, etc.--as well as participate in national and regional activities at a reduced rate. Chapter subscribers, on the other hand, receive only the local newsletter (and must pay a little extra to attend national events). Local meetings and recitals, of course, are open to everyone, including the public. (See breakdown on enclosed membership form.)

Although many other chapters of AGO charge more for dues, we have kept our chapter portion low enough to make joining our chapter more affordable, while at the same time charging enough to enable us to sponsor activities, workshops, recitals; pay newsletter costs; etc., in order to be of service to each member and to Utah Valley. (The fact that so many members of our chapter have freely given of their time and talents to make our chapter activities successful has also kept costs down.)

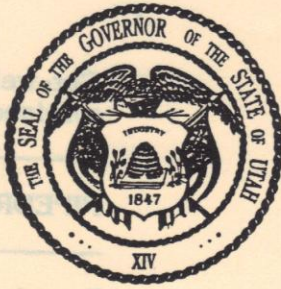

Declaration

Whereas, the American Guild of Organists was founded in New York City on April 13, 1896; and

Whereas, the first Chapter of Guild Organists was established in Utah in 1937 with Dr. Frank Asper as the Dean; and

Whereas, Utah now has five chapters (Cache Valley, Ogden, Salt Lake City, Utah Valley and Southern Utah) with a membership of approximately 200 organists; and

Whereas, the Guild was established to advance the cause of organ and choral music, to increase their contributions to aesthetic and religious experiences, and to promote their understanding, appreciation, and enjoyment; and

Whereas, the Guild provides members with opportunities to meet socially and for discussion of professional topics; and

Whereas, the Guild members have a wide range of abilities from the most proficient professionals to beginners and even members who simply enjoy organ music, and membership is open to everyone;

Now, Therefore, I, Michael O. Leavitt, Governor of the State of Utah, do hereby declare Saturday, April 13, 1996, as the

American Guild of Organists 100th Birthday

and encourage the citizens of Utah to enjoy one of the many recitals being presented on April 14, 1996 to celebrate the American Guild of Organists Centennial.

QUICK VEGETABLE PIZZA

- 2 large, thin Boboli pizza crusts
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened
- 1 .04 oz. pkg. dry ranch dressing mix
- 3-4 cups chopped or shredded raw vegetables (broccoli, carrots, radishes, cucumbers, peppers, etc.)

Combine sour cream, cream cheese, and dressing mix. Spread over pizza crust. Place vegetables over pizza crust. Cover and chill.
