The poem describes a community choral society gathering to sing Handel's Messiah. I particularly like the last three stanzas:

Aren't we enlarged
by the scale of what we're able
to desire? Everything,

by song: hear how it cascades, in overlapping, lapidary waves of praise? Still time.

He explains, "I have a longstanding distrust of 'illustrating' poems in practically any fashion; usually I'd prefer to let the words do the work they were made for. But what producer Anne Davenport and her fellow PBS staffers made here delights me; the poem seems opened out to a wider audience, and the editing is so intelligently done that I don't even notice the cuts in the text made for time's sake. Four minutes on the evening news? What more could a poet ask for -- at least when it comes to speaking in the social space."





The purpose of the Committee on the New Organist (CONO) is to introduce non-organists of all ages to the organ, and to further motivate and develop new organists. The committee creates age-appropriate means, materials, and programs for engaging them, and for enabling their development as performers. It oversees such programs and resources as The New Organist web page and PipeWorks. It also assists the CoPOE, CCPE and other committees in projects involving new organists.

The new AGO <u>Strategic Growth Plan</u> presents many opportunities for CONO to become a major force in engaging, supporting, and uplifting every organist – especially those new to the organ. The CONO Panel of Advisors would serve voluntarily on an as-needed basis to advise the committee in their projects and directions. The time commitment will be entirely at the advisors' discretion and can be small and occasional.

As the support of new organists represents a significant opportunity for increasing the diversity of AGO membership, both nationally as well as internationally, Michael is highly interested in collaborating with a panel that represents such diversity.
